For the webmaster – I need someone who knows the newer standards and designs. The existing site is dated and is not a Responsive-Design. I know what it is, but I don't have the


> knowledge on how to implement that. The site needs a redesign and updating. If you just want to help with the redesign and know something about Responsive-Design and HTML coding, please contact me.

Secretary of the Army (SECARMY), began fielding the Army's new Joint Light Tactical Vehicle (JLTV), started planning for a multibrigade training event, and celebrated all of the Battalion's accomplishments at the Battalion's Military Ball.

Mark Esper, the incumbent SECARMY, toured the BN's motor pool and met with Soldiers and their families on January 11th. The reason for the SECARMY's visit was to continue his tour of all Army Divisions in order to better familiarize himself with the force. Events that Mr. Esper hosted were town hall meetings with Soldiers and Leaders to discuss current problem sets the army faces, a Family Readiness Group luncheon, and other discussions about Army readiness. Soldiers and spouses were awarded coins from the SECARMY for their performance and contributions during his visit.

The Cottonbalers are a part of the 1st Brigade (BDE) in the Army to receive the new JLTV vehicles. The JLTV will replace the Battalion's current fleet of High Mobility Multipurpose turer, Oshkosh Defense, before utilizing these vehicles in a March training event.

In March, the Soldiers of 2-7 Infantry will serve as the opposing force for 2nd BDE, 3ID as they continue to prepare for upcoming National Training Center rotations. The Battalion will face various missions ranging from conducting a defense to executing an attack against overwhelming odds. This training event gives us the opportunity to take our Abrams Tanks and Bradley Infantry Fighting Vehicles into the field alongside our new JLTVs while testing our mission command and logistical systems.

On January 19th, the Battalion hosted the Cottonbaler Ball at the Savannah Marriot Riverfront. Over 500 Soldiers and their guests enjoyed a night of celebrating the Battalion's recent redeployment and accomplishments. Door prizes were awarded to lucky Soldiers, the grog was filled to its brim, and espirit de corps was at an all-time high. In place of a guest speaker, the Battalion produced a video showcasing the 7th Infantry Regiment's remarkable history from 1814-2018. May God bless you all and have blessed Lent and Easter Season and Passover for our Jewish brothers!


